Dual Enrollment Information

Worcester County Public Schools/Wor-Wic Community College

Overview:

Under the College and Career Readiness and College Completion Act of 2013 (CCR-CCA) Senate Bill 740, a "dually enrolled student" is defined as a student who is dually enrolled in a secondary school in the State and an institution of higher education in the State. The Dual Enrollment Program is available to high school students who are seeking to earn college credit(s) at Wor-Wic Community College. Select students, accepted to Wor-Wic, are enrolled in college courses while still attending high school, providing an educational experience beyond what is available at the secondary level. High school juniors and seniors who meet the standards outlined in the memorandum of understanding (MOU) that has been established with Wor-Wic, may enhance their schedule with college course work and experience the independence of college-level study while also earning college credit.

The Dual Enrollment Program enables high school students to:

- Register and attend a Wor-Wic Community College course(s) on campus or at their high school site (*Please note that all courses are not offered at each high school. Contact the school counselor for more information*)
- Engage with outstanding college professors and their peers in a collegiate classroom setting
- Graduate from high school with earned college credit
- Potentially save money on college tuition
- Accelerate college completion
- Gain additional skills and confidence needed to succeed in college

Students may enroll in a variety of courses at the college, provided they meet the Dual Enrollment standards. The credits earned may be applied to a degree program at Wor-Wic or may potentially be transferred to another institution.

Requirements:

Sixty (60) days prior to seeking approval for dual enrollment, students must meet with a guidance counselor in their school to review all of the requisite conditions and to develop a plan of action to meet these conditions. Juniors and seniors who have earned at least 16 high school credits may take college credit (not remedial level) coursework at Wor-Wic Community College in order to further their education. Students planning to attend must present evidence they have met ALL WCPS eligibility requirements prior to being released from high school during the school day. Students must take four credits of high school or dual enrollment coursework and may be awarded no more than the maximum number of credits permitted by the high school schedule for the year. Courses taken at Wor-Wic must be courses that are not offered at the student's high school, unless granted an exception by the Chief Academic Officer.

Students enrolled in this program will be responsible for completion of all application materials required by the institute of higher learning and payment of all applicable fees, textbooks, and transportation. In addition, students must:

- be a senior or a junior who has earned at least 16 high school credits;
- be at least 16 years of age by the beginning of the college semester;
- have completed all service learning requirements;
- have successfully met HSA requirements;
- submit evidence of admission to the college/university;
- submit a Dual Enrollment Certification Form
- submit evidence of having tested into credit bearing courses in an institution of higher learning (such as PARCC/MCAP English 10, PARCC/MCAP Algebra II, SAT, ACT, and/or Accuplacer in RELA and Math); or submitting evidence of having met the requirements outlined in the local agreement with the institution of higher education(see Step 2 below);
- submit current student schedule
- submit transcript showing a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale;
- submit transcript with successful completion of Algebra II;
- enroll in four courses during the senior year;¹
- submit parent/guardian permission letter;
- be certified by the school counselor as meeting all of the eligibility requirements outlined above;

Upon approval from the school principal, a letter of recommendation from the principal along with the Dual Enrollment Checklist is sent to the Chief Academic Officer for final approval.

Procedures:

Step One:	EDUCATION PLAN : Meet with your high school counselor to discuss your overall education plan to include your high school program of study and the college course(s) you wish to take. *See list of eligible courses and requirements below.					
Step Two:	ASSESSMENT TESTING: Present evidence of having tested into credit bearing courses in an institution of higher learning, such as PARCC/MCAP English 10 and PARCC/MCAP Algebra II, SAT, ACT, and/or Accuplacer in RELA and/or Math, Qualifying Scores: • PARCC/MCAP English 10 and PARCC/MCAP Algebra II – Level 4 or 5 (750 or higher) • SAT scores of 480 or better in Evidence-Based Reading & Writing and 530 in Mathematics • ACT – 21 or greater • Accuplacer • Reading & Writing – 263+ • Quantitative Reasoning Algebra and Statistics (QAS) – 263+ • Or have met the eligibility requirements outlined in the current local agreement: have earned a 3.0 cumulative unweighted high school GPA, with at least a 3.0 cumulative unweighted GPA at the completion of their four required English courses and/or Algebra II grades of "C" or better for students who want to take MTH102 or MTH152 or a "B" or better for students who want to take MTH121.

¹ Students must enroll in a course providing a fourth year of mathematics either at the high school or college level.

	with the college's payment deadlines.

To participate in Dual Enrollment through the high school and Wor-Wic Community College, a high school student must:

- be a junior or senior,
- * be at least 16 years of age by the beginning of the college semester,
- possess a cumulative grade point average of 2.50 or above,
- be enrolled in one of the public school systems in the college's service region or in a non-profit institution offering instruction at the secondary level that is either operating with a Certificate of Approval issued by the Maryland State Department of Education or registered with the Department as a Church Exempt School, and
- * be certified by an official of the high school as meeting all of the eligibility requirements outlined above.

This form must be completed and brought to Wor-Wic Community College prior to enrolling in any class. Once certified, the student will complete the normal registration process. Diagnostic testing and prerequisite requirements must be met prior to enrolling.
